

<u>COMPETENCY A</u>: Champions teacher and staff excellence through continuous improvement to develop and achieve the vision of high expectations for all students. Principal creates and implements systems to ensure a safe, orderly, and productive environment for student and adult learning toward the achievement of school and district improvement priorities. Principal works with the staff and community to build a shared mission, and vision of high expectations that ensures all students are on the path to college and career readiness, and holds staff accountable for results.

- Our Attendance Rate for:
 - September 95.4%
 - October 95.06%
 - Currently for November is 94.6%
 - Mondays and Fridays continue to be a concern for the school, as most students do not attend school on these days. Therefore, we will continue to implement Attendance Incentives. Our school-wide attendance goal is: 96%.
 - Students with perfect attendance for the month of October were celebrated with a field trip to Lucky Strikes or a Pizza Party and Open Gym on November 1. We will continue to celebrate students with perfect attendance each month.



- Network 9 Deputy Chief Reynolds and her team conducted an Instructional Rigor Walk on October 19. The Instructional Walk focused 15 key instructional practices. We visited 9 classrooms and the finding were:
 - o 8/9 classrooms had standards aligned learning targets posted
 - 1/9 partial standards aligned to standards
 - 8/9 classrooms had learning targets at comprehension or above
 - Taxonomy of student task aligned to learning target or was higher than taxonomy than the learning target
 - o 9/9 classrooms had full alignment of student learning and learning target
 - 8/8 ELA classrooms the lesson learning tasks are focused on reading, writing, or speaking about content-specific, grade-level text
 - o 5/9 classrooms had students interacting with partners or groups

- o 6/9 classrooms had evidence of student experiencing productive struggle when working in pairs/groups.
- o In most classrooms, ELA curriculum was utilized.
- o Positive climate and culture throughout the school.
- o Students were engaged in the learning in all classrooms observed.

<u>COMPETENCY B</u>: Creates powerful professional learning systems that guarantee learning for all students. The principal works with the school staff and community to utilize the district's framework for effective teaching and learning to improve instruction for all students

- Mrs. Roberson and Principal Pollard continues to attend Network 9 monthly Administrators Meetings.
- The BHT & CCT Teams continues to meet weekly and attend Network 9 monthly meetings.
- Mrs. Ude, Mrs. Thompson & Ms. Bevly attended the Innovative Schools Summit in Chicago on November 2-4. The workshops focused on students at risk, diverse learner and students with trauma.
- Mrs. Roberson & Mrs. Boateng conducted a Math Workshop on October 27, 2023 for all teachers of math.
- Principal Pollard conducted several Literacy PD for all Kindergarten-5th grade teachers on November 7, 2023.
- All Kindergarten-8th grade teachers were invited to attend Envision Math After School Workshop on November 8, 2023.
- All teachers are invited to attend Doug Fisher Gradual Release of Responsibility Virtual Workshop on November 15 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

<u>COMPETENCY C</u>: Builds a culture focused on college and career readiness. Principal works with staff and community to build a culture of high expectations and aspirations for every student by setting clear staff and student expectations for positive learning behaviors and by focusing on students' social-emotional learning.

- We welcome the return of parent volunteers to assist in the classroom, coach a sports team or club, chaperone field trips, and help in the cafeteria and recess. The district has revised its vaccination requirement. If you would like to volunteer, you must complete the volunteer application for Level 1 or Level 2 via www.cps.volunteers.org. Once completed, the volunteer must provide the main office with a photo ID for school level approval. Please Note: If you were an approved parent volunteer last year, you will need to reapply. All parent volunteers must complete this process each year! The application process can take up to two to 5 weeks.

<u>COMPETENCY E</u>: Relentlessly pursues self-disciplined thinking and action. • Operations, Facilities and Maintenance Updates

- In compliance with the Illinois School Safety Drill Act and CPS Policy, all schools are required to conduct a minimum of eight (8) drills a year. We have conducted a Fire, Bus Evacuation and Lockdown drills. We will conduct a Tornado drill prior to the winter break.
- o The fencing for the playlot is expected to be installed in November. The fencing is on backorder.
- o The staff parking lot will be resurfaced and parking spaces (lines) designated in the coming weeks.
- o The locksmith is in the process of changing all classroom door locks.
