# February Attendance Challenge



We will continue our attendance challenges in February! There are 19 student attendance days for this month. Students who have perfect attendance **or** attend school 18 of 19 days in February will receive an incentive. **Please note**: Students with early dismissals prior to 2:45 p.m. are marked as half day absent and this will disqualify them from the incentive.

School attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. Students who attend school regularly with an attendance rate of 95% or higher and arrive to school on time have been shown to achieve higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. One of the most powerful ways to prepare a child for success in life is through regular school attendance. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. We realize some absences are unavoidable due to health problems or other circumstances. When your child must stay home from school, please follow CPS procedures to notify the school in writing, by telephone or through E-Absence – a new way to report excused absences through the Parent Portal. You can sign in to your account at <u>ASPEN.CPS.EDU</u>. CPS recognizes <u>six reasons for an absence to be considered excused</u>:

- Sounding taps at a military funeral for a deceased veteran
- Parent or legal guardian is an active duty member of the uniformed services and has been called to duty for, is on leave from,
- or has immediately returned from deployment to a combat zone
- student illness
  - This includes mental or behavioral health (As of January 1, 2022, absences can be attributed to mental or behavioral health for up to five days based on Public Act 102-0321.



- observance of a religious holiday (absence note required)
- death in the immediate family
- family emergency
- circumstances which cause reasonable concern to the parent for their child's safety or health (must be approved by the principal)

## **Outside Food Policy**

Students are prohibited from bringing outside food items into the school for distribution or selling. For safety and food allergy reasons students should not consume any food items from their peers. Students can eat the meals from the cafeteria or any food items brought from their home. Food deliveries of any kind are not permitted during or after school hours. This includes pizza delivery, Uber Eats, etc. Homemade food items are not to be shared in any group setting. Finally birthday cakes, cupcakes, candy, pizza, etc... for birthday celebrations <u>are not permitted</u>. Each child's birthday may be recognized in the classroom with approval from the classroom teacher, but only with non-food items.

## Student Arrival and Early Dismissal



It is imperative that students arrive to school on time at 8:45 a.m. When students arrive late to school, they miss valuable instructional minutes. If it is necessary for your child to leave school prior to the dismissal time of 3:45 p.m., **please note that: Early Dismissals will not be granted after 3:15 p.m.** 

# Cell Phone Policy



Students are strongly encouraged not to bring a cell phone and other devices such as earbuds, earphones, headphones, beats, pods, smart watches, or chargers to school. If students bring their cell phone to school, s/he must adhere to the following:

- Turn off the cellphone.
- The teacher will collect all cellphones at the beginning of the school day. Teachers will store and secure all cellphones in a lockbox during the day. Cellphones will be returned to students at the end of the day.
- In the event that your child must call home, the child may use the telephone in the main office.
- In the case of a family emergency, the office staff will certainly give your child a message or have him/her return your call.

Any student who violates these expectations will be held accountable to the Student Rights & Responsibilities/Student Code of Conduct.

#### COVID Test Kits

If you need a COVID At Home Test Kit, you may pick-up one from the main office, call the main office to request one be sent home with your child, or have your child pick-up one from the school nurse.

# Parent Volunteers

We welcome the return of parent volunteers to assist in the classroom, coach a sports team or club, chaperone field trips, and help in the cafeteria and during recess. If you would like to volunteer, you must complete the volunteer application for Level 1 via <u>www.cps.volunteers.org</u>. <u>Once completed, the volunteer must provide the main office with a photo ID</u> <u>for school level approval</u>. Please Note: If you were an approved parent volunteer last year, you will need to reapply. All parent volunteers must complete this process each year! The application process can take up to 2 to 5 weeks.
