Student attendance rates are increasing thanks to you! Currently, our attendance rate for August through November is 95.36% that is nearly a 2% increase from last year. School attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. Students who attend school regularly and on time have been shown to achieve higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. One of the most powerful ways to prepare a child for success in life is through regular school attendance. Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success.

During the winter break all Kindergarten-8th grade students will receive Holiday Homework Assignments will be given via hardcopy or on-line (*Nearpod, Discovery Education, IXL, iReady Reading/Math, or Raz-Kids*). The Holiday Homework assignments must be completed by **Monday, January 8th**. Holiday Homework will be graded and input into Gradebook by Friday, January 12th.

We are committed in helping all our students recover both academically and social-emotionally. We remain hopeful that we can continue to address our challenges and make academic progress toward our goals, providing our learners with a nurturing climate and culture and academic supports they deserve.

Cell Phone Policy (Reminder)

Effective August 21, 2023, students are strongly encouraged <u>not</u> to bring a cell phone to school. **If students bring their** cell phone to school, s/he must adhere to the following:

- Turn off the cellphone.
- The teacher will collect all cellphones at the beginning of the school day. Teachers will store and secure all cellphones in a lockbox during the day. Cellphones will be returned to students at the end of the day.
- In the event that your child must call home, the child may use the telephone in the main office.
- In the case of a family emergency, the office staff will certainly give your child a message or have him/her return your call. If a student must call home, they can do so in the main office.

Students will not have access to their cell phones at any point during the school day (this includes during lunch/recess periods). To ensure the integrity of assessments, all students are prohibited from having cell phones in a classroom or other location where an assessment is being administered.

We know we are better when we work to support one another. Students are expected to comply with these expectations. If a student is found to be in possession or use of a cell phone, the phone will be confiscated, placed in a labeled envelope, and delivered to the main office. The consequences will be as follows:

1st offense:

- ✓ Cell phone will be confiscated and held in main office until the end of the day.
- ✓ An administrator will review the cellphone policy with the student and the cellphone will be returned to the student at the end of the day.
- ✓ Parent or guardian notified.

2nd offense:

- ✓ Cell phone will be confiscated held in main office until the end of the day.
- ✓ A parent or guardian/student/administrator meeting will be held, where an administrator will review the cellphone policy with the student and parent.
- ✓ The cellphone will be returned to the parent/guardian.

3rd offense

- ✓ Cell phone will be confiscated held in main office until the end of the day.
- ✓ Parent or guardian notified.
- ✓ A parent or guardian/student/administrator meeting will be held, where an administrator will review the cellphone policy with the student and parent.
- ✓ The student will be subject to a one (1) day in-school suspension.

The cell phone policy letter was emailed to parents in July. The entire parent letter can be found on our school's website. All students must adhere to the cell phone policy.
