Who is my child’s teacher?

How will my child be graded during this 1st quarter?

The Illinois State Board of Education recommends that CPS return to their regular grading practices (pre-Covid). This means that standard letter grades will be issued for students based on mastery of content, with the exception of Traditional Kindergarten students. See grading calculations and scales below.

Grade Calculations

Classwork = 40%
Test = 25%
Quiz = 20%
Homework = 15%

Grading Scale

100-90 = A
89-80 = B
79-70 = C
69-60 = D
59 & Below = F

Traditional Program

Kindergarten students are not given formal letter grades.
Instead, students will receive either

W (Well Developed)
P (Progressing)
B (Beginning)

Report cards will be distributed at the end of each 10-week quarter.

Will my child's attendance be affected if they don't log into class, but still completes the work?

CPS will also return to their regular attendance protocols. This means that in order for a student to be marked **P**resent, they must be logged on at the start of each class. If a child logs on after 9:05 a.m., they will be marked **T**ardy. If a student logs in to some, but not all of their scheduled classes, they will be marked as **½ day absent**. Tardies and absences will be recorded on a student's permanent record. Parents can either call Mrs. Morgan-Percy, Attendance Coordinator at 773-535-0530 ext.8 to ask for their child's absence to be excused, or parents can fill out a written request to have the absence excused via a Google Form located on our school's website([Carnegie.cps.edu](https://www.cps.edu)) under the tab "Remote Learning."

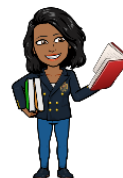
How can I gain access to view my child's grades?

Parent Portal is the platform used to easily and conveniently check grades, attendance, and other information regarding your child's progress. To create an account, you must first email AP Roberson (segriffin@cps.edu) and request access to your child's records. Once you are verified as a custodial parent/guardian, you will receive a separate email from ASPEN with a validation code that you will use to create your account. If you have multiple children, regardless of the school they attend, you only need one Parent account to monitor all records. AP Roberson can also assist with linking your children's accounts.
