Homework Procedures and Grading Policies:

According to CPS Policy, 5th grade students should spend 45 nightly minutes completing reinforcement practices. Homework should be completed and placed in the corresponding subject's folder and is reviewed and collected typically the following school day. There are some assignments that will not be collected and graded, but reviewed for students to assess their own understanding.

Homework will be given Monday-Thursday with the exception of projects and research.

Missing Classwork: Missing work is recorded in the grade book as **50%** with a note **DID NOT SUBMIT**. If a student has a missing assignment, they have 24 hours from the date the assignment was due, to turn in their classwork. **INC** is used to denote no credit for an incomplete assignment, and also holds the weight of **50%** with a note. The code **E** is used at the teacher's discretion to mark an assignment as excused. Excused assignments have no effect on the students overall average.

Parent Portal: Parents are expected to check Parent Portal on a regular basis to monitor their child's academic progress. Oftentimes, parents have questions about what assignments their child is missing or what grade their scores on specific assignments. **Most** parent inquiries can be answered by checking the parent portal before contacting their teacher. To set up a parent portal, an access code is required and can be retrieved **only** by a parent/guardian in the main office.
