What happens when someone tests positive for COVID-19 in CPS?



When someone tests positive for COVID-19, they should report their case to CPS at cps.edu/covidresults so that contact tracing can begin. When a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19 is identified in school, our contact tracing team will determine if the individual was in the building while contagious and establish who were close contacts.

NOT Exposed | NOT a Close Contact

STFP 1

STEP 2

Includes anyone who was in the building the same day as the positive individual, but DID NOT interact with the case in a way that defines them as a close contact. Simply being in the same building or at the same event as a positive or symptomatic person does not mean you are a close contact or need to quarantine.

Exposure | Close Contact

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention define close contact as being within six feet of a COVID-19-positive person with or without a mask for 15 or more minutes within a 24-hour period. In some situations, a cohort will be asked to quarantine.

After completing an interview with the individual who tested positive and reviewing entrance logs of the CPS office or school, the contact tracing team will notify any individuals who were identified as close contacts of the need to quarantine. The school community will be send a notification informing them when a confirmed case was present in the building.
